The Mississauga Nation are Anishinaabe. people of the Great Lakes, and constitute a nation by virtue of our creation, shared histories, language, culture, values, traditions, beliefs and aspirations.

The Mississauga Nation holds a number of different narratives of the legacies of migration, relationships, and interactions with Canada that have led us to the present, but it is clear that the Mississaugas are a distinct part of Anishinabek Nation. Our history is tied to the Great Lakes area; intimately tied to the waterways and abundant harvest.

The Mississauga Nation consists of six modern communities: Alderville First Nation, Curve Lake First Nation, Mississaugas of Rice Lake Hiawatha First Nation, Mississauga First Nation, Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation, and Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nation. As our relations continue to strengthen, Mississauga Nation will continue collaboration efforts in Culture, Justice, Governance and Economic Development.

Mississauga Nation Chiefs, elders, youth, and community members have confirmed us as a Nation. We self identify as Michi-Saagig people when introducing ourselves. It is with great pride that we continue to foster our relationship amongst the Mississauga Nation.
