Schedule "B" - List of Collectable and Non-Collectable Refuse and Recyclables

"Non-Collectable Refuse" means any waste, other than collectable Refuse, and shall without restricting the generality of the foregoing include the following:

- 1. Manufacturer's or industrial waste;
- 2. Explosives and any highly flammable or volatile substances of any nature whatsoever;
- 3. Liquid or gaseous waste, caustics and acids;
- 4. Poison, pesticides and herbicides, radioactive material;
- 5. Septage, raw sewage sludge and industrial process sludge;
- Medical waste including but not limited to infected materials, including dressings and bandages, needles, syringes;
- Organic material which has not been drained of all liquid in accordance with the provisions of the bylaw;
- 8. Carcasses or parts thereof of any animal or other creature, save for bona fide kitchen and table waste;
- 9. Live animals or birds;
- 10. Hay, straw and manure:
- Any materials which have become frozen to a container and cannot be removed therefrom by normal shaking efforts;
- 12. Stock of any wholesaler or retailer e.g. eggs, fish, pickles, fruit and vegetables;
- 13. Sawdust and/or shavings of any kind from a commercial and/or industrial establishment:
- 14. Broken plaster, railroad ties, pallets, lumber or other waste resulting from the construction, alteration, repair, demolition or removal or any building or structure;
- Discarded tires with or without rims, trucks automobiles and other vehicles and any parts thereof or accessories thereto;
- 16. Refrigerant units and white goods including fridge, freezer, stove, microwave, dishwasher, drying and washing machines etc.,
- 17. Scrap metal including water tank, stainless steel sink, fixtures, bed and bike frames, etc.;
- 18. Tree trunks, stumps and sod;
- 19. Bricks, gravel, rocks, cement including patio stones and ornaments or fill of any kind;
- 20. Cardboard boxes that are wet and fall apart prior to or during collection;
- 21. Household paints, solvents;
- 22. Loose items not properly contained in a prescribed garbage container;
- 23. Brush, yard waste, grass clippings;
- 24. Items placed in oversized garbage bags;
- 25. Litter and broken or ripped open garbage bags;
- 26. Electronic and electrical waste (E-Waste);
- 27. Excess waste or waste over the allotted limit for the property.

Schedule "C" - Non Collectable Large Items

"Non Collectable Large Items"

- 1. No car parts
- 2. No tires
- 3. No white goods
- 4. No appliances
- 5. No construction, renovation, demolition material
- 6. No boats
- 7. No kayaks
- 8. No canoes
- 9. No basketball standards/hoops/nets
- 10. No batteries
- 11. No municipal hazardous or special waste (MHSW) e.g. pressurized cylinders
- 12. No radioactive waste
- 13. No broken glass

"Non-Collectable Recyclables" means any recyclable, other than collectable Recyclables, and shall, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, include the following:

- 1. Fax, carbon, was or foil covered paper;
- 2. Waxed cardboard, foil pouches and aluminum foil lined containers, hardcover books or their covers;
- Ceramics, china, light bulbs, window glass, crystal drinking glass;
- 4. Coat hangers, aerosol cans, baking and frying pans, silverware, oil filters;
- 5. Needles and syringes;
- 6. Plastic oil, antifreeze or pesticide containers, plastic film and wrap, and all utensils;
- 7. Styrofoam;
- 8. Plastic toys, plant pots and trays, and unmarked plastics;
- 9. Containers that have residual food left inside;
- 10. Broken glass, window glass;
- 11. Non-fibre material being placed in the recycling box or in the recycling toter cart used for paper and newsprint only.
