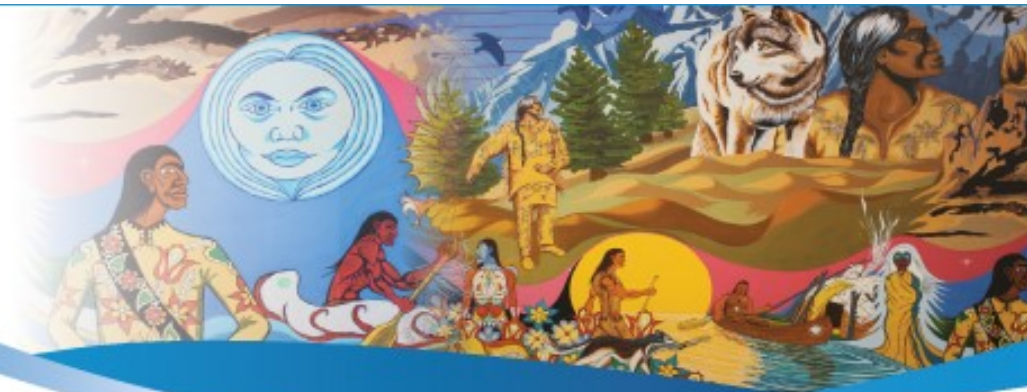

# There is always room to recycle!

You will find recyclables in every room of your house.

**LOOK INSIDE!**

**Office:** newspapers and flyers, magazines, books and phonebooks. All types of paper and envelopes with plastic windows.

**Garage/Workshop & Laundry:** Cardboard boxes tied in bundles no larger than 90cm x 90cm or 3ft x 3ft. Detergent bottles. Empty metal paint cans, lids removed, plastic plant and pot trays.

Soap boxes.

**Kitchen:** Cereal, pizza and other food boxes—food removed. Boxed beverage containers: Tetra Paks, juice & soup boxes, milk & juice cartons, cardboard cans. Glass, plastic & metal food & beverage containers. Clear plastic “clam shell containers,” single serve plastic food containers, aluminum foil and aluminum baking trays.

Plastic bags, plastic film, styrofoam & plastic cutlery.

**Bedroom:** Magazines, books, and paper clothing

**Bathroom:** Tissue boxes, toilet paper rolls and other product boxes, shampoo, conditioner and soap bottles, glass jars and empty hairspray and other aerosol cans.

Items listed in *blue* go in your **Blue Box**



Items listed in *black* go in your **Garbage**

## Garbage Collection Essentials

- Garbage is collected weekly on Wednesdays.
- Set out your garbage at the curb / end of your driveway for collection by 8:00 a.m. every Wednesday.
- You are entitled to four (4) bags per household.
- Bags or cans can be placed at the curb for collection, not exceeding 45lbs.
- Grass clippings are **not accepted** for curbside collection. Grass clippings can be taken to The Canborough Waste Management facility for a fee.
- Construction, demolition and renovation waste is not accepted for curbside collection. These items can be taken to Canborough Waste Management Facility for a fee.

The Canborough Waste Management Facility transfer station has a new Diversion Centre that makes it easier for residents to recycle a number of new materials that may not be acceptable to place at the curb. There are various bins available at the Diversion Centre.

## Acceptable Material

- Scrap metal
- Metal appliances (with No Freon)
- Tires
- Yard waste
- Batteries (other than automotive)
- Household and commercial waste
- Construction and demolition material

## Unacceptable Materials

- Household hazardous waste
- Explosives and ammunition
- Propane tanks
- Appliances that contain Freon
- Automotive batteries
- Fluorescent bulbs
- Asbestos waste

## Community diversion services

### On-site at New Credit

- Residents and establishments located in MCFN can bring their acceptable 'WEEE' goods (electronic waste like: cell phones, desktop and laptop computers, printers, copiers, telephones, cameras and video cameras etc....) for disposal at the Administration Office and Social / Health Services Centre.

- The only Hazardous Waste services available to residents of MCFN is the managing of "sharps" (needles). Residents can take sharps to the MCFN Social / Health Services Centre for disposal.

## Bulky Item Disposal

**BULK ITEMS WILL BE COLLECTED CURBSIDE TWO (2) TIMES PER YEAR  
IN THE SPRING AND IN THE FALL**

### Suitable items

---

Items **Suitable** for curbside Bulk Collection are items like desks, beds, couches, chairs, tables and other bulk “furniture type” items.



### Un-suitable items

---

Items **NOT Suitable** for curbside bulk collection are things like industrial waste, explosives (ie propane tanks), household hazardous waste, medical waste (including syringes/needles), construction/demolition waste, tires or any car parts, brush, stumps, electronic waste or white goods (appliances).



# Acceptable Items



SINGLE STREAM, NO-SORT RECYCLING IS EFFICIENT, IT SAVES TIME AND SPACE AND IT IS GOOD FOR THE ENVIRONMENT!

## RECYCLE RIGHT, MISSISSAUGAS OF THE CREDIT FIRST NATION

Include these items (rinsed and free of grease, food and other residue) in your single stream recycle bin – no sorting or bagging required.

### PLASTICS

**WHAT** Plastics labeled #1–7 including bottles, lids, containers, take-out food containers, clamshells and trays, #5 and #6 single serve coffee pods.

**HOW** Rinsed and free of grease, food and other residue.



### GLASS

**WHAT** Glass bottles and jars.

**HOW** Rinsed and free of grease, food and other residue.



### POLYCOAT

**WHAT** Boxed containers for beverages and soups.

**HOW** Rinsed and free of grease, food and other residue.



### METAL

**WHAT** Tin food cans, lids and beverage containers and aluminum cans.

**HOW** Rinsed and free of grease, food and other residue.



### PAPER

**WHAT** Newspaper, magazines, printed paper and shredded paper.

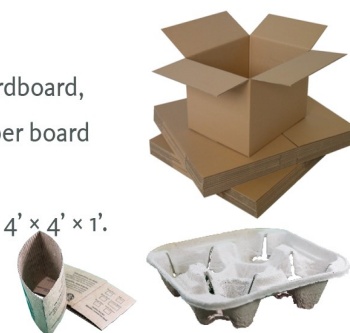
**HOW** Shredded paper in a clear plastic bag. This is the only item that should be bagged.



### CARDBOARD

**WHAT** Corrugated cardboard, box board, paper board and cartons.

**HOW** No larger than 4' x 4' x 1'.
