The 34th annual Three Fires Homecoming Pow wow and Traditional Gathering was held August 20th and 21st, with entertainment night on the 19th.

Because of the pandemic, it was the first in-person Three Fires pow wow since 2019.

"We tried to keep it alive (during the pandemic) with videos and different things but it's just not the same," said Stacey Laforme, elected chief of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

"This weekend, I think the most special thing is seeing the people come together and talking and visiting, and seeing the youth.

"And then seeing our friends and allies come in and spend time with us. It means a lot. We do things together and we work on things. Once in a while we might go for dinner, but this (pow wow) beats all that."

The Pow wow drew approximately 3,000 people (spectators and participants)

"All powwows are welcoming, but ours are such a feeling of inclusivity and everybody's welcome," said Laforme.

### MCFN RETURNS TO THE CANADIAN NATIONAL EXHIBITION

Our exhibit features a new hologram technology by ARHT Media that displays videos and has an interactive option where guests can come take photos in the hologram.

This display makes it easier to educate on MCFN's Culture and History, and issues that affect Indigenous people including; Residential Schools, and Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls. Indigenous talent will also be featured, such as the Manitou Mkwa Singers, Daniel Secord (a traditional dancer from MCFN), and many more. MCFN representatives will be at the CNE throughout the event's duration, and will be answering questions from visitors at their booth. This initiative will allow for a different way that MCFN can engage with people, and a way that will appeal to people as the world is becoming more and more advanced with technology.

Jai King-Green who works in MCFN's Culture and Events Unit, and is a member of the Manitou Mkwa Singers was impressed by the hologram technology at the JUNO awards when the group was nominated for Traditional Indigenous Artist of the Year in 2022. She thought it would be a great opportunity for MCFN to educate people at larger-scale events, such as the CNE.

"We were able to record videos and messages from people from the nation, about important matters and I think the big questions and topics Canadians would have been asking about."

"We have been attending the CNE for a number of years, and we are looking forward to returning and bringing something new. We are always looking to share our history and our stories to a wider audience, and this initiative with ARHT allows us to do this in a unique way." – Gimaa (Chief) Stacey Laforme

- Identifies new and enhanced programs, services, infrastructure and other initiatives to implement in the community

### From the Post-Secondary desk in Lifelong Learning...

Been thinking about your future, not sure Post- Secondary is really your thing? Post- Secondary has trade options, too. The best part is that some of these start in high school, so you can make sure a trade is a fit before you invest your post- secondary funding in it.

Still in high school? Check out OYAP, Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program. Check out SHSM, the Specialist High School Major, as well. Both will give you a taste of the trades, both can provide pathways into trades, both are good preparation. Even better, if you do a Specialist High School Major and go to Post-Secondary in the same stream, you could be in for more than just a well-fitting career. For instance, Confederation College has created the Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) Award and made it available to students entering directly from high school and who have a SHSM designation on their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) it can come with an award of up to \$500 (payable in 1st year). Niagara College offers a bursary of \$1,000.00 for qualifying SHSM.

Not every College may have your chosen trade, not every high school offers the OYAP/SHSM in your area of interest, or do they? You should look, check them out; try the idea on for size. These could lead to your future life goals!

### **CERTIFICATE OF INDIAN STATUS CARDS (CIS)**

- Status cards are issued by appointment only, every Thursday and Friday.
- We will issue status cards to members of other First Nations for an additional fee and with permission from their First Nation.
- Adults 16 years and older must provide 2 pieces of ID with one being a photo ID.
- Minors 15 years old and younger must have 1 piece of their own ID and 1 piece of parent/guardian photo ID.
- <u>NOTE</u>: Expired ID will not be accepted, with the exception of expired status cards on the condition the expiry date is no more than 6 months. We **DO NOT** accept photocopies of ID.
- <u>Acceptable ID</u>: birth certificate, health card, drivers licence, provincial photo ID card, Employee ID (with digitized photo), Student ID (with digitized photo), status card (cannot be expired for more than 6 months), firearms licence, Passport/Nexus card (counts as two pieces of ID)

### CERTIFICATE OF INDIAN STATUS (CIS) vs SECURE CERTIFICATE OF INDIAN STATUS CARDS (SCIS)

- CIS cards are only issued by the First Nation (Beige with red strip)
- SCIS cards are only issued by Indigenous Services Canada (hard plastic, white card)
