HOURS OF WORK:	Monday to Thursday – 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Friday 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Occasional evening and/or weekend work will be required to meet operational and programming needs.

DUTIES:

Preventative Maintenance and Repair

The WWMT will be responsible to execute preventative and corrective maintenance of all water and wastewater equipment and facilities to maintain them in a functionally reliable state. In collaboration with the WWM and WWS, the incumbent will:

- With minimal supervision, carry out prescribed monitoring, operation, and maintenance functions in the water and wastewater treatment plants and in the Water Distribution and Wastewater Collection System.
- Execute Preventative Maintenance (PM) work orders assigned through MSIFN's CMS (Hippo)
- Conduct daily inspections; water and wastewater quality testing; process and operational adjustments; and preventative maintenance in the treatment plants, water distribution, and the wastewater collection infrastructure
- Participate in the rotational on-call schedule, responding to emergencies, and weekend checks of facilities operation and security
- Provide team leadership and support to the water wastewater operators on maintenance and repair activities in order to enhance on-the-job development of technical skills
- Participate in the development of the Preventative Maintenance (PM) programs; establish tasks, activities, and schedules.
- Assist the WWM and WWS in the analyses of equipment and system performance; adjust PM programs as needed to enhance performance
- Respond to emergency breakdowns to minimize interruption to water and wastewater operation
- Maintain an inventory of essential parts and materials to facilitate PM and Emergency Repair tasks
- Assist the WWM and WWS in the development of contingency plans in case of catastrophic emergency failure to water and wastewater services within the community. Contingency plans must be well documented, assessed for viability, and endorsed by the First Nation Manager, and Chief and Council
- Conduct tests of emergency notification systems for Water and Wastewater.
- Document performance as per prescribed SOPs

Related and other duties:

- Assist WWW Operators and often perform WWW Operator duties when assigned, or if waiting to be assigned further maintenance duties
- Active participation in meetings and training sessions
- Assist in annual budget preparation for operation and maintenance
- Special projects, assigned electrical and mechanical assistance to other MSIFN Departments; and additional duties as required by the WWM and WWS

Other Accountabilities:

Together with others in the water wastewater group, be accountable for the group's inventory of tools and maintaining test equipment in good condition always. The group will also ensure the required inventory of parts and materials for the operation and maintenance of the water and the wastewater systems is maintained at all times.

- Community college Diploma in an environmental science and technology program or an engineering related program with a focus on the water and/or wastewater principles and technologies, or and equivalent combination of education, licensing and experience
- Prefer minimum MECP Class 2 Licenses in Water Treatment and Water Distribution & Supply and MECP Class 2 Licenses in Wastewater Treatment and Wastewater Collection
- Committed to safe work practices and maintaining a safe work environment
- Demonstrated computer literacy is highly essential, including competency with Microsoft Applications
- Adaptable to a Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) environment
- Able to maintain a high degree of accuracy in maintenance record keeping and reporting
- Flexibility around scheduling and job duties
- Competence and experience to work safely with tools
- Knowledge and experience with water treatment concepts and technologies; knowledge and experience with water distribution & supply concepts and the infrastructure
- Knowledge and experience with wastewater treatment concepts and technologies; knowledge and experience with wastewater collection concepts including sewage lift pumping; and associated infrastructure
- Knowledge and experience with chemical handling including Sodium Hypochlorite as used for disinfection in water and wastewater treatment systems

- Experience with databases such as Water Trax for data entry and report generation
