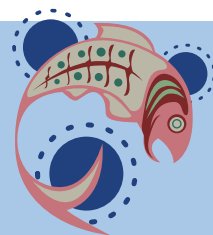
ECC opens its new location in LSK

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OGIMAA KWE CLAIRE SAULT

It's been a productive month of assessment. The Council spent the first few days in office receiving information from every department and assessing the workload, costs and efficiency of each.

The onboarding of the new Council provided us with the ability to assess how we'll move forward for the 2023/2025 term. While we are still gathering information and still have decisions before us, I reiterate that we will be ready to roll out the 2-year plan on Saturday, February 24th.

As the Chief, I thought it was important for an initial meet and greet with Minister of Crown-Indigenous Relations, Gary Anandasangaree and discuss the priorities for our term. I further wanted his perspective on the timing for the pending next Federal election and how that timing will be critically important with the MCFN priorities, like Treaty 22/23 land claim settlement and Additions to Reserve policy changes. As some of you know, I opened the Indigenous Night at the NHL game in Toronto. As the Chief, it is important to reaffirm, in a more concrete manner, that Treaty 13, is the sole jurisdiction of MCFN. If you watched that hockey game, you would have heard my delivery.



I am committed to educating the public on this issue and more importantly the business community within our treaty territory. We are currently exploring the idea of hiring a Public Relations firm to assist MCFN and MCBC with messaging the public. The Council spent the day exploring an investment in Niagara on the Lake that was introduced to MCFN by the former Council. We are still in the process of completing our due diligence on this company. More will be communicated at the February 24th community meeting.

I did the opening and welcome remarks at the Ontario Native Women's Association in Niagara Falls on Monday January 22. It's important that we have a supportive relationship with this organization and the work they carry out for our Indigenous women. The new Land Claims Negotiation team was established, and a strategy is being developed for how we move forward on Treaty 22 and 23 claims. Again, more will be discussed at the February 24th meeting. This will be the start of healthy discussion and community feedback as we move forward.

We are currently in the process of reviewing our efficiencies within the administration. As I mentioned at the swearing in ceremony, we will assess the necessary changes to the current political and administrative structure as we contemplate moving away from the Pillar process that you, the community members, perceive as an impediment to the community overall...

MESSAGE FROM OGIMAA KWE

As Chief, I am committed to transparency and bringing a better financial understanding to you as members. I want you to be aware that we are still working on the 2022/23 audit. I'm told by the Finance department that it will be completed by the end of January.

The financial status of any organization or company is one of your most important guiding documents. Budgets were approved in December 2023. We are still reviewing each of the Council's pillar roles and the responsibilities they carry within the governance structure.

Honorariums and attendance of Council meetings will be posted to our "Members Only" communication portals.

Lastly, I presented the idea of putting the Constitution in abeyance until further consultation can take place with the membership, but certain Council members did not agree. They opted to exercise article 12 of the Constitution that was passed by a fraction of the membership last year. Therefore, I am bringing it to the members for further discussion and direction on February 24th...

I understand, you the membership elected this Council because you wanted change. In particular you wanted the Constitution rescinded until we have a more wholesome discussion and understanding of what it means for generations to come!

January 23, 2024

Today, our government announced new permanent measures to make it easier for Indigenous communities and families seeking and registering certain vital event documents in the province.

First, our government is permanently waiving the fees for Indian Residential School Survivors and their families who wish to reclaim traditional names that were changed by the school system. We are also waiving the fees for people seeking to change their name to a single name if it is in accordance with their traditional culture.

Next, our government is providing a streamlined, one window process to reduce the burden for those seeking death registration searches, certificates and certified copies of death registrations. As part of today's announcement, we are permanently waiving fees for those important documents. Fees are also being waived to register the death of children who attended Indian Residential Schools.

Our government recognizes the painful legacy that Indian Residential Schools still have today. It is our hope that by providing permanent relief, we are able to provide support to communities and families at every step of their journey towards healing.
