Job Summary: The Pedagogical Lead will work alongside Educators and support practices that enable them to be thoughtful and intentional about their work with young learners. They will promote deep professional and pedagogical engagement through research, reflective practice, and critical, collaborative dialogue. Support Educators to reimagine Early Childhood Education as an opportunity for social and cultural responsiveness. Ensure the overall implementation of all Early Learning and Child Care innovation programs are meeting the goals and standards of the framework and that the educators are consistently and deliberately striving for excellence.

- A Degree or Graduate Degree in Early Childhood Education or related discipline with experience of pedagogical practices;
- Must hold a Diploma in Early Childhood Education from an Ontario College of Applied Arts and Technology,
- OR a diploma from a recognized post-secondary program recognized by the College of Early Childhood Educators
- OR a letter of recognition of equivalency issued by the Association of Early Childhood Educators of Ontario (AECEO).

- Ability to work independently and as part of a team with limited supervision;
- Must be able to handle clients in crisis and deal with stressful situations in an effective manner.
