### MESSAGE FROM OGIMAA KWE

### **OGIMAA KWE CLAIRE SAULT**

Another school year has come to a close and big congrats to all of our students for the perseverance and hard work this past year.

**Finance** – Audits for 21/22 and 22/23 were presented at the community meeting on July 27, 2024. Hard copies will be made available, and copies will be posted to the members portals.

**Org Review** is completed, and we will begin to implement minor structural changes. We will be interviewing next week for the CAO position. The majority of the outcome report focused on areas of immediate focus such as communication and what steps we will take to implement policy and behavioral changes to improve.

This is one of many examples where important items/issues have to be communicated to the staff first and the members. A report from the consultants will be posted to MCFN members in the next couple of weeks. It's certainly been a valuable experience for the Council, especially, to focus on priority areas that require urgent action steps.

**Meetings** with various political leaders continue to be an important part of building relations. The Council recently met for an afternoon with the Waterloo Mayor and Council and will be meeting with Halton Hills Mayor and Council in the coming weeks. I'm also working on developing relations with our urban Indigenous organization leaders in hopes that we can collaborate on various projects. In addition, the Council has a meeting scheduled in September with the Mississauga Nations.

**Pow Wow** excitement is building for our upcoming Pow Wow. We received confirmation that several elected officials will be joining us and confirmation from the Lt. Governor, Edith Dumont will be partak-



ing in our Pow Wow on August 24th. The Council has been making a diligent effort to invite the external community and public officials to join us that weekend.

**Transition/change** always comes with behaviour changes from all of us. We are in a transition with staff changes and implementing changes that will help with our efficiency. So, bear with us as we move through the changes. We are working diligently on improving the overall organizational health, mindset and most importantly, the new and improved ways we will carry out the services that MCFN provides to both on and off reserve members.

I hope you're having a great summer and I'm looking forward to seeing everyone at the Pow Wow.

## **Councillor Larry Sault Community Update**

As the community knows, MCFN was welcomed back as a Member Nation of the Association of Iroquois and Allied Indians. I was asked to represent our Nation on June 6, 2024 (photo with Grand Chief Joel Abram (Oneida), Deputy Grand Chief Stacia Loft (Tyendinaga Mohawks), and youth representative (Caldwell First Nation).

The Assembly of First Nations hosted the Annual General As-

sembly in Montreal from July 8-11, 2024, the traditional territory of Kahnawake Mohawks. Pierre Poilievre (Progressive Conservative) delivered his first speech to Chiefs and is confronted about Stephen Harper's legacy. PC's have never been friendly to First Nations in Canada. Some First Nation leaders turn their backs on him during the entire presentation. He promised less interference from his government and more eco-

nomic control.

NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh also addressed the Assembly. He was warmly welcomed and took questions from the floor for an entire hour after his presentation to Chiefs. He assures First Nations that, if elected to govern this country, the NDP will build a Canada where there is more justice, compassion and action - a country where we all rise. He went on to say that Liberal and Conservative governments chose not to uphold and honour our rights. Federal elections are slated to take place in October 2025.

#### ASSOCIATION OF IROQUOIS AND ALLIED INDIANS WELCOMES THE MISSISSAUGAS OF THE CREDIT FIRST NATION

London and Hagersville, ON July 19<sup>th</sup>, 2024 – At the 54<sup>th</sup> Annual General Assembly for the Association of Iroquois and Allied Indians (AIAI) on June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024 proved to be one for the history books as they welcomed a newly selected Deputy Grand Chief but also welcomed the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation (MCFN) as it's newest Member Nation increasing the number of Nations that make up AIAI from seven to eight.

Grand Chief Joel Abram says "On behalf of the collected leadership at our Annual General Assembly I welcome the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation with open arms and am honored to have been a part of them joining the Association during my time in office. Credit was one of the founding members of AIAI back in the 1960's when they came together with the other Member Nations in order to fight the white paper after their departure they worked on some projects before wishing to return to AIAI. I am looking forward to meeting with and working with Mississaugas of the Credit Chief Claire Sault"

Deputy Grand Chief Stacia Loft says "In a Chiefs Council, in accordance with AIAI policy, their membership under went discussion and a vote was held in which the leadership agreed to welcome them to the Association. We are very happy to have them with us and we look forward to working with them to help advocate for their rights. I am eager to meet with Chief Claire Sault and the Mississaugas of the Credit Council"

The Mississaugas of the Credit are a First Nation based in southwestern Ontario. Their reserve occupies just under 6,000 acres. As of 2022, 957 of the First Nation's 2,731 members live on reserve (see also Reserves in Ontario).

The MCFN occupied, controlled and exercised stewardship over approximately 3.9 million acres of lands, waters, and resources in Southern Ontario. The territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit became some of the most heavily populated and highly industrialized land in all of Canada.

#### CHILD WELFARE LONG TERM REFORM FINAL SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT REACHED

London, Ontario July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2024 – The negotiation teams of the Assembly of First Nations (AFN), the Chiefs of Ontario (COO), and Nishnawbe Aski Nation (NAN) reached agreement with Canada on a Final Settlement Agreement (FSA) on Long Term Reform on child welfare for a total of 47.8 Billion dollars over the next ten years. Before the FSA is finalized, each First Nation party needs to follow their internal approval processes and the Chiefs in Assembly will vote to approve or decline the FSA in September. The FSA was reached after over two years of negotiations as an attempt by Canada to resolve orders stemming from a 2016 CHRT decision that found that Canada was discriminating against First Nation children in the area of child welfare.

Grand Chief Joel Abram says "It's important that we cover all our bases and that a fully informed decision is made when dealing with such a big complex issue, and the FSA reflects that. Being directly involved in negotiations, it was very important that we reached an agreement that we felt we could recommend and support to the First Nations and our leadership. This FSA we feel will give a good amount of resources, capital, and flexibility to address both the over representation of First Nation kids in the child welfare, to focus on prevention rather than apprehension, and to help First Nations build the capacity to exert their jurisdiction over child welfare. Many people were involved in the FSA, from the negotiation team, including our legal, the FSA Advisory Committee, the Chiefs Committee on Social, the Leadership Council, the elders who sat with us, and many other staff, youth, knowledge keepers and other leadership."

Deputy Grand Chief Stacia Loft says "There is still a ways yet to go but the end is in sight and that is encouraging especially after struggling with the Government about this for so many years. Some might be thankful and grateful to the Government for it's efforts in coming to the table about these discussions and negotiations however, I feel that many others would take a different approach given it is the Canadian Government that has put us in this position in the first place. If they had only paid heed to our calls and protests much earlier then neither of us would be in the position we are in today. It is their responsibility to be doing this work."

## Life Events of Registered MCFN Members

LIFE EVENTS ARE BIRTHS, MARRIAGES, DIVORCES, NAME CHANGES AND DEATHS.

#### Birth

In order for your child to be registered on the Mississaugas of the Credit membership list you must register the birth with Indigenous Services Canada (ISC). You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

Only those entitled to registration on the MCFN membership list will be registered. ISC will notify you if your child is not eligible for registration.

#### Marriage

To register your marriage you must submit a request for amendment form, a copy of your marriage certificate and copies of your identification showing your married name. You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

#### Divorce

To register your divorce you must submit a request for amendment form, a copy of your divorce certificate and copies of your identification showing your maiden name. You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

#### Name Change

To register a name change you must submit a request for amendment form, a copy of the name change certificate and copies of your identification showing your new name. You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

#### Death

When a Mississaugas of the Credit member passes away the death must be registered with Indigenous Services Canada. If a death is not reported the deceased individual will remain on the MCFN membership list. You can submit a death certificate to the MCFN Lands & Membership Dept. or to ISC.

## Overview of Sections 6(1) and 6(2) of the Indian Act

6(1)(a) - Entitlement of person who was registered or entitled to be registered on or before April 17, 1985
6(1)(a.1) - Reinstatement of individuals whose names were omitted or deleted from the Indian Register, or a band list prior to September 4, 1951.

6(1)(a.2) - that person meets the following conditions:

(i) they were born female during the period beginning on September4, 1951 and ending on April 16, 1985 and their parents were notmarried to each other at the time of the birth,

(ii) their father was at the time of that person's birth entitled to be registered or, if he was no longer living at that time, was at the time of death entitled to be registered, and

(iii) their mother was not at the time of that person's birth entitled to be registered;

**6(1)(a.3)** - that person is a direct descendant of a person who is, was or would have been entitled to be registered under paragraph (a.1) or (a.2) and

(i) they were born before April 17, 1985, whether or not their parents were married to each other at the time of the birth, or

(ii) they were born after April 16, 1985 and their parents were married to each other at any time before April 17, 1985;

**6(1) (b**) - Entitlement for individuals who are members of a group declared to be a Band after April 17, 1985

**6(1)(d)** - Reinstatement for an individual who was enfranchised by voluntary application prior to April 17, 1985

**6(1)(e)** - Reinstatement for an individual that was enfranchised prior to September 4, 1951 for reasons of living abroad for 5 or more years without the consent of the Superintendent General or becoming ministers, doctors, lawyers ("professionals" only until 1920) **6(1)(f)** - Entitlement for children with both parents entitled to registration **6(2)** - Entitlement for children when only one parent is entitled to registration under 6(1) and the other parent is not entitled to registration.
