MESSAGE FROM OGIMAA KWE

OGIMAA KWE CLAIRE SAULT

February 28, 2025

It has been a busy month for the Chief (myself) and all of the Council. Councillor Larry, Councillor Veronica and I attended the AFN National Forum in February in Vancouver BC. The Assembly of First Nations hosted a National Forum on the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (UNDA) on the unceded and ancestral territories of the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleilwauth Nations. The National forum discusses the implementation of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People and the best practices and strategic approach to advancing First Nations Rights in the current political climate.

We also met with CIFAR's (The Canadian Institute for Advanced Research) President & CEO Stephen Troope in Toronto this month. Our meeting was the beginning of laying out a foundation for building and a relationship with the Mississauga of the Credit First Nation and CIFAR through Massey College and the upcoming opening of the Legacy Space on March 3, 2025.

The "She is Wise" Conference is an annual event where I gave opening remarks at the Sheraton Fallsview Hotel in Niagara Falls. "She is Wise" was put on by the Ontario Native Women's Association. At ONWA they celebrate and honour the safety and healing of Indigenous Women and Girls as they take up leadership roles in the family, community internationally for generations to come. ONWA was established in 1971 and delivers culturally enriched programs and services to Indigenous women and their families regardless of their status or loyalty. ONWA is a not-for-profit organization that empowers and supports all Indigenous women and their families in Ontario through research, advocacy, policy development and programs that focus on local, regional and provincial activities. It was an honour to be a part of ONWA opening day that emphasizes and encourages the empowerment of Indigenous women and the preservation of Indigenous culture, language and heritage.

I attended the AIAI Chiefs council meeting in Rama. Productive meeting with an emphasis and discussion on the external current political strategy and proactive measures each First Nation will take with candidates running.

You've probably have noticed the presence of the Peacekeepers in the community. The Peacekeepers will be heading off to complete their training in March. We are happy to have them onboard as welcome addition into the community. This is a pilot project intended to help reduce, deter or prevent crime from happening. The OPP will continue as usual and have welcomed the idea of the Peacekeepers in the community for preventative measures.

Chief and the Council are working diligently with both the Federal and Provincial Governments to come to an agreement with the Land Claims Rouge River, T22 & T23. Negotiations continue. With Ontario calling their election and the pending federal election, we remain committed to continuing forward with senior staff. We've had some changes with our senior executives (CAO & CFO) who are both on a administrative leave pending the

outcome of separate investigations. As an interim measure, we have contracted Eddy Robinson to step into the role.

The Council continues to work on our Seven Generations – Comprehensive Community Plan and will be meeting with a planner to help us with our priorities for the rest of this year. We are close to finalizing our laws and anticipate the consultation to begin by late spring.

ANNOUNCEMENT ADVANCE PAYMENT TREATY 22



February 28, 2025 - On this, the 205th anniversary of the signing on Treaty 22 with the British Crown, back on February 28, 1820, Mississaugas of the Credit Council is pleased to announce that the Government of Canada has presented us with an Advance Payment towards the final settlement of this Land Claim.

The Claim, submitted in 2019, asserts that the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation (MCFN) reserve lands, covered by Treaty 22, were surrendered to the Crown in trust and consequently the land should have been maintained, used, or sold solely for the benefit of the First Nation. Regrettably, this did not happen.

Canada has now agreed to negotiate a settlement of this Claim with MCFN and substantial progress towards a final settlement has been made. On February 11, 2025, MCFN agreed to accept Canada's offer of an Advance Payment in the spirit of advancing reconciliation between the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and Canada. MCFN has set up a Trust to receive the Advance Payment and keep the monies safe.

On February 27, 2025, Canada deposited \$30 million dollars into our Trust. No vote of Membership is required to accept this Advance Payment, since no final settlement of the claim has yet to be reached. This is a good-faith gesture by Canada and its seriousness to finally settle this Claim. To this end, negotiations are ongoing, and it is our hope that a final agreement can be reached, that can be approved by Membership, late this year or in early 2026.

As always, to the extent we are able, members will be kept up to date as we move forward towards the final settlement of this very important Claim. A joint announcement will be made this Sunday March 2nd, 2025, in Toronto, regarding this Advance Payment.

Grand Erie Public Health Advises of Four New Measles Exposure Locations

Grand Erie Public Health (GEPH) is advising community members of four new measles exposure locations in our region. Exposure to the measles virus may have occurred at the following locations, dates, times as indicated:

- Blue Elephant, 96 Norfolk St S, Simcoe, on February 19, 2025, from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m.
- **Dover Dental**, 18 Chapman St E, Port Dover, on <u>February 21, 2025, from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.</u>
- Flux Brewery, 185 Oakland Rd, Scotland, on <u>February 21, 2025, from 6:30 p.m. to</u> 10:30 p.m.
- Norfolk General Hospital Emergency Department, 365 West St. on February 26, 2025, from 6:15 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.

If you were at these locations during these times, were born in 1970 or later, and are **not up to date with your vaccinations**, please contact your primary healthcare provider or call public health at <u>519-753-4937 ext. 454 or 905-318-6623 ext. 3438</u>.

Measles is a highly contagious disease caused by a virus. It spreads easily when an infected person breathes, coughs, or sneezes. It can cause severe disease, complications, and even death.

Measles can affect anyone but is most common in children. It infects the respiratory tract and then spreads throughout the body.

<u>Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation Health Services</u> will have **Drop In Vaccine Clinics** <u>every Friday afternoon</u> from **1-4pm** March **7**th, **14**th, **21**st, and **28**th.

Measles: What You Need to Know About Vaccine Eligibility

Eligibility for measles vaccines have been expanded due to an ongoing measles outbreak in Grand Erie Public Health and Southwestern Public Health.

Who is eligible?

The following populations are eligible to be vaccinated against measles if they live, play, travel to, worship, or otherwise gather in the Grand Erie Public Health and Southwestern Public Health regions:

- Babies 6 to 11 months of age
- Children 1 to 4 years of age (recommended to receive their second dose early)
- Adults born in and after 1970 (recommended to receive a second dose)

Measles is a life-threatening disease.

- Vaccination is the most effective protection against measles infection
- A single dose of measles-containing vaccine is estimated to be 85% to 95% effective
- After a second dose, the vaccines approach 100% effectiveness

Why is expanding eligibility recommended?

- A local measles outbreak increases your exposure risk
- Measles can live in the air and on surfaces for 2 hours
- 9 in 10 people without immunity to measles get sick when exposed to the virus
- 1 in 5 people without immunity are hospitalized when they are infected with measles
 - Those under 5 years of age especially those under 1 year of age - are at high risk of measles complications
 - Complications include pneumonia, brain inflammation and death
 - Adults born in and after 1970 are recommended to receive a second dose of a measles vaccine to prevent community transmission

Is my child too young for a measles vaccine?

- Measles vaccines are safe for those over 6 months of age
- Babies receive some measles protection while in the womb which protects them until 12 months of age
- Babies 6 to 11 months of age are recommended an additional dose of measles vaccine when the risk of measles infection is increased (such as during travel or outbreaks)

Are measles vaccines safe?

- Measles vaccines are proven to be safe and have been used nationally since the 1970's
- Side effects are usually mild and improve in a few days



Housing Repair/Renovation & Sanitation (HRRS) and/or CMHC/RRAP Program

This is a program to improve the quality of your home and to address all MANDATORY Health, Safety, & Structural deficiencies in and outside of your home.

HRRS applications can be picked up at the Housing office (agimaw gamig Building-Administration) or you may call the Housing Assistant, Amanda LaForme at 905-768-1133 ext.1225 to request an application be mailed to you or emailing <u>Amanda.LaForme@mncfn.ca</u> to have an application e-mailed to you.

<u>Applications are to be returned to the Housing Office</u> on or before and no later than March 31,2025 – no later than 4:00 p.m.

Once the deadline of MARCH 31, 2025 has passed, and all applications submitted:

- Inspections will be set up to inspect your home identifying not only the repairs you request but also to ensure that all Health, Safety, Structural deficiencies are addressed.
- ✤ A specification report will be drawn up and you will be required to attend the Housing office to view the specification report or the report will be mailed directly to you.
- After review of the Specification Report, you will sign off of the Specification Report that you are in agreement with all listed items.
- You then will be required to obtain at least 2 estimates per item listed on the specification report.
- Housing Staff, based on Program criteria will determine which program applicant qualifies for (CMHC/RRAP Program and/or the MNCFN HRRS Program or both, IF available)

*<u>Applications submitted after the deadline</u> date will be dealt with on funding availability.

Discretionary/Cosmetic items can only be completed <u>if dollars are available</u> and once <u>all Mandatory Health, Safety, & Structural items have been addressed for all applicants</u>.







For Emergency: (addressed as situations arise)

>If heating/plumbing, or electrical issues arise, a service man MUST BE CONTACTED FIRST to identify the problem, and once THE PROBLEM IS IDENTIFIED, an inspector is sent to verify the situation, specifications will be drawn up, and 1 estimate submitted. >Public Works Department may deem 2 estimates are necessary if estimate submitted appears too high or too low.

>Also, a letter from your insurance company must be provided stating that the repair is not covered by your insurance company.

Note: Proof of income, Proof of land ownership where house is situated, and house insurance (copy of policy) <u>is required at time of application</u>.



HOUSING NEW PROGRAM



Housing New applications are ongoing and can be picked up anytime throughout the year. You may attend the Housing Office located in the agimaw gamig building (Administration) to obtain an application or you may request to have a Housing New application mailed to you by calling 905-768-1133, Ext. 1242 or emailing <u>Colette.Webb@mncfn.ca</u> to have an application emailed to you.

Once your housing application has been submitted and checked to ensure that the application has been filled out properly, signed and dated you will be placed on the housing new list.

Thereafter, each and every year, you will receive notification by letter of your placement number on the housing list as you move up the list.

There are approximately 124 individuals listed on the housing new list.

Children are placed on the waiting list in accordance to the 'Priority Requirements Chart' and then by the date and/or time of the completed forms received by Maawdoo Maajaamin Child Care (MMCC). When spaces become available, the family will be contacted by the MMCC Supervisor or Assistant Supervisor.

We also hosted a new program 'Toddler Baking'! The toddlers loved mixing, measuring, and being a part of the process.

partnerships- Tsitewahket joined us at one of our dinners. We made bath time medicines and facial scrubs with our families.! Tsitewahket is a land base program geared towards prevention. They provide programming to all population's children, adults, and families from all walks of life – meaning everyone is welcome to participate in their programming. Life Events of Registered MCFN Members

LIFE EVENTS ARE BIRTHS, MARRIAGES, DIVORCES, NAME CHANGES AND DEATHS.

Birth

In order for your child to be registered on the Mississaugas of the Credit membership list you must register the birth with Indigenous Services Canada (ISC). You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

Only those entitled to registration on the MCFN membership list will be registered. ISC will notify you if your child is not eligible for registration.

Marriage

To register your marriage you must submit a request for amendment form, a copy of your marriage certificate and copies of your identification showing your married name. You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

Divorce

To register your divorce you must submit a request for amendment form, a copy of your divorce certificate and copies of your identification showing your maiden name. You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

Name Change

To register a name change you must submit a request for amendment form, a copy of the name change certificate and copies of your identification showing your new name. You can submit all required documents to the MCFN Lands & Membership Department or mail directly to ISC.

Death

When a Mississaugas of the Credit member passes away the death must be registered with Indigenous Services Canada. If a death is not reported the deceased individual will remain on the MCFN membership list. You can submit a death certificate to the MCFN Lands & Membership Dept. or to ISC.

Overview of Sections 6(1) and 6(2) of the Indian Act

6(1)(a) - Entitlement of person who was registered or entitled to be registered on or before April 17, 1985
6(1)(a.1) - Reinstatement of individuals whose names were omitted or deleted from the Indian Register, or a band list prior to September 4, 1951.

6(1)(a.2) - that person meets the following conditions:

(i) they were born female during the period beginning on September4, 1951 and ending on April 16, 1985 and their parents were notmarried to each other at the time of the birth,

(ii) their father was at the time of that person's birth entitled to be registered or, if he was no longer living at that time, was at the time of death entitled to be registered, and

(iii) their mother was not at the time of that person's birth entitled to be registered;

6(1)(a.3) - that person is a direct descendant of a person who is, was or would have been entitled to be registered under paragraph (a.1) or (a.2) and

(i) they were born before April 17, 1985, whether or not their parents were married to each other at the time of the birth, or


(ii) they were born after April 16, 1985 and their parents were married to each other at any time before April 17, 1985;

6(1) (b) - Entitlement for individuals who are members of a group declared to be a Band after April 17, 1985

6(1)(d) - Reinstatement for an individual who was enfranchised by voluntary application prior to April 17, 1985

6(1)(e) - Reinstatement for an individual that was enfranchised prior to September 4, 1951 for reasons of living abroad for 5 or more years without the consent of the Superintendent General or becoming ministers, doctors, lawyers ("professionals" only until 1920) **6(1)(f)** - Entitlement for children with both parents entitled to registration **6(2)** - Entitlement for children when only one parent is entitled to registration under 6(1) and the other parent is not entitled to registration.
