# Contest Details and Submission Form

Trans-Northern Pipelines Inc. (TNPI) initiated our Reconciliation Action Plan work in 2024, and we strive to promote reconciliation through our business practices. We are achieving this by working to build an internal infrastructure that is consistent with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) Calls to Action.

TNPI is holding an Art Contest based on the theme "Your Vision of Truth and Reconciliation in Canada" to support the growth and promotion of Indigenous youth artists in our operating areas.

# **Prizes**

- 1<sup>st</sup> Prize \$2,000
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize \$1.000
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Prize \$500

Winning entries will be used in the following ways:

- Display of reproductions of the artwork, and the description, in TNPI offices
- Reproductions will also be used in:
  - 1. TNPI Reconciliation Action Plan documents
  - 2. Internal and external reconciliation communications, including on our website
  - 3. Winning entrants will receive a framed collage of winning entries
  - 4. Winning entries may be used by TNPI employees as backgrounds in our Teams meetings

# **Contest Rules**

- Registration Deadline: December 1, 2025
- Art Submission Deadline: March 1, 2026 (collectively, each registration and submission together is an "entry")
- Entrants must be from invited communities and be between 16 and 35 years of age.
- All entries must include a short description (2-3 paragraphs) of what their art represents and what it means to the artist.
- Artwork mediums accepted: Paintings, drawings, collages, photography/digital
- Entries will be declared invalid if:
  - They are submitted late or are ineligible, incomplete, non-compliant or forged.
  - There is a brand or a logo, like the logo of an Indigenous community, sports team, business, restaurant or chain of cafés, anywhere on them.
  - They portray another person or a nation, country, ethnic group, race, religion, age group, sex, gender, sexual orientation or disability in a negative manner.

- They contain elements that are deemed offensive or inappropriate, including but not limited to nudity, vulgarity or violence.
- All original artwork will be returned to the artist.
- All winning entries may be incorporated, either individually or as a collage, into published TNPI Reconciliation Action Plan documents, displays, and on internal and external reconciliation communications, including on our website.
- While winning entrants retain copyright in the works submitted, by taking part in the Contest, they grant TNPI the right to reproduce, publish, display and use the works in all media and by all means of distribution for the purposes described here, and waives their moral rights in favour of TNPI for such purposes.
- The contest is not open to the selection panel or employees of TNPI.
- Personal information provided by entrants will be used for administrative purposes in connection with the contest, except that entrants' names may be used for attribution of their art.
- Winners will be notified prior to the announcement of winners by email and phone. If a winner does not respond within 5 business days, the next-placed entry will be selected. If TNPI is unable to reach a winner within this period, or if that winner refuses to accept the prize, TNPI is released from any obligation to that winner with respect to the prize.
- TNPI reserves the right to cancel or suspend the Art Contest at its sole discretion, for any reason whatsoever.
- TNPI reserves the right to change, without notice, the Art Contest rules, the prizes or any terms.

### Submissions Process

- Complete entries should be submitted digitally, by mail/courier, or in-person to a TNPI office (by appointment only). Individual details can be confirmed with Cheryl Forner at <u>cforner@TNPI.ca</u>.
- Each entry **must include an original work with the entrant's name, a short description** (2-3 paragraphs) of what their art represents and what it means to the artist (this description may accompany the piece of art in our Reconciliation Action Plan, displays, and on our website), and a submission form completed by the entrant, or their parent or legal guardian.

### Selection Process

- The selection process will be completed in two stages:
  - 1. A selection panel made up of TNPI's President & CEO; Director, Regulatory & External Affairs; Team Lead, Communications and; Advisor, Indigenous Relations & Engagement will select the top 10 entries based on incorporation of the theme, creativity, and quality. If fewer than 10 entries are received, all entries will progress to Stage 2.
  - 2. A digital representation of each entry, along with the artist's description, will be released to all TNPI employees for review and ranking from 1 to 5
    - The entries ranked 1, 2 and 3 will win first, second and third prize, respectively.
    - The entries ranked 4 and 5 will be alternates in case a winner cannot be reached or an entry is invalid.



- In the case of a scoring tie the selection panel will meet, discuss, and vote to break the tie.
- Winning entries will be announced no later than May 15, 2026.
