### **AGENDA ITEM NO. 3 – OPP MONTHLY REPORT**

OPP Andrew Fox gave a report for the month of April. There were the following:

#### **Statistics Reported:**

- 11 criminal charges
- 3 motor vehicle collisions
- 1 highway speed-related incident
- 2 impaired driving incidents
- 0 overdoses within MCFN

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#### **Discussion**

##### **Impaired Driving:**

Councillor Larry Sault inquired whether impaired driving incidents in the community are primarily drug- or alcohol-related.

- Constable Andrew Fox advised that incidents are **mostly alcohol related**.

##### **School Safety Planning (LSK School):**

Councillor Larry Sault asked about proactive planning in the event of a potential school shooting at LSK School.

- Constable Andrew Fox confirmed that the OPP currently has a **floor plan of the school**.
- Constable Rod LeClaire stated that he would be conducting a **walk-through lockdown exercise at the school the following day**.
- It was recommended that the **A/CAO provide updated floor plans**, including the **new school extension**, to Constable Andrew Fox and Constable Rod LeClaire.

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#### **Community Engagement – Constable Rod LeClaire**

Constable Rod LeClaire reported participation in the following activities:

1. Community clean-up
2. Historical gathering
3. Visits to two families who experienced recent bereavements
4. Ongoing involvement with the FIFA planning team, with **weekly meetings on Tuesdays**

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#### **Additional Requests and Follow-Up**

##### **Communication Protocol:**

Councillor Leslie Maracle requested that when OPP attend the community in response to an issue, they notify the Chief regarding the situation.

- Constable Rod LeClaire agreed and noted that he maintains an **emergency contact list**.

##### **Action Item:**

- Council requested that Constable Rod LeClaire **provide his contact list to A/CAO Veronica King-Jamieson**.

#### **AGENDA ITEM NO.4 TREATY WEEK-LEGISLATURE BUILDING QUEEN'S PARK (EF)**

Councillor Erma Ferrell brought this item to the table.

The manager from the Archives of Ontario has contacted me to obtain permission from the MCFN Chief and Council to display the Treaty 13 documents at Queen's Park. The manager believes in our philosophy of "nothing about us, without us".

The MCFN Chief and Council will be invited to be part of the opening ceremonies on Monday November 02, 2026, at the Lieutenant Governors' Suite, (Edith Dumont) at Queen's Park to view the documents. The manager has already acknowledged that smudging in the LG's quarters will be allowed to begin the ceremony, along with a prayer, song and a drum, to begin the program.

Additional planning will begin once permission is granted from the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation Chief and Council. The funds will be used for the coach bus, and for LSK students.

It was asked by Councillor Jai King-Green why the money for this event was coming from Employment and Training and not Lifelong Learning. Councillor Erma Ferrell stated that she could check with the CFO Tabitha King to see if there was money in the Lifelong Learning budget for it. The Council accepted Councillor Erma Ferrell's recommendation.

Councillor Larry Sault suggested that this is an opportunity for MCFN to do some training or videos on our Treaty land and train the guests about who we are.

It was asked by Council that Councillor Erma Ferrell would give them a list of names of the guests that would be attending this event.

**DIRECTION NO. 3**

That the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation Regular Council directs Councillor Erma Ferrell to check with Finance to see if Lifelong Learning has the dollars to cover Treaty Week instead of taking it from Employment and Training.

**AGENDA ITEM NO. 7 – STANDARD AGENDA ITEM -EMT ITEMS- FIFA CARAVAN**

The A/CAO presented information on behalf of the FIFA team regarding an upcoming event. Councillor Jai King-Green advised that the event is expected to attract at least 2,000 attendees. The event will be held at the LSK school grounds. While the school will already be closed for summer holidays, the on-site daycare will also be closed for the day of the event.

Councillor Jai King-Green noted that planning for this event has been underway for approximately six weeks. Overflow parking arrangements have been identified at the Administration Building and the library.

Event Timeline:

- July 6, 2026: Event setup
- July 7, 2026: Main event day
- July 8, 2026: Teardown

Councillor Jai King-Green also informed Council that a FIFA Coordinator will be hired to oversee event logistics. Additionally, a request was made to temporarily close all non-essential departments on July 7, 2026, and redeploy staff to assist with the event.

Council agreed to the temporary realignment of departments on July 7, 2026, and approved the redeployment of staff to support the event.
