AGENDA ITEM NO. 4 – TRANSITION TO EXTEND PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY NARRATIVE-BLUE BOX (AL)

Arland LaForme introduced Belinda Beirsto from the Ecologix Recycling company. Belinda Explained the Ontario Government requirement for all Producer Responsibility Organization(PRO) be responsible for their recycling costs.

Belinda was asking MCFN to authorize the Ontario First Nations Technical Services Corporation and Public Works Department to proceed to the next stage of contract negotiations with Circular Materials.

Circular Materials (CM) operates a common Collections System for Blue Box Material on behalf of the Ontario Producers and Producer Responsibility Organizations and seeks to support the continued collection of Blue Box Materials from MCFN Nation residents. The old system the Producers did 50/50 of the cost. Under the new system, the Producers will be paying 100% of the cost.

The council agreed to move forward with the agreement. Arland LaForme will bring the agreement back to the council table when it has been completed for approval.

MOTION NO. 3

MOVED BY JESSE HERKIMER SECONDED BY FAWN SAULT

That the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation Regular Council accepted the presentation of the EPR Narrative-Blue Box Recycling.

Furthermore, the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation Regular Council approve the authorization of commencement of agreement negotiations with the following terms:

Collection

- CM will arrange for curbside collection of Blue Box services directly with the curbside service provider, Emterra to continue to provide weekly curbside collection of single-stream Blue Box Material to the community.
- CM will pay the service provider, Emterra to provide curbside collection of blue box services to Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation to provide weekly curbside collection of single-stream Blue Box Material to 292 single family households, 1 multi-family building with 8 dwelling units, and 1 school totaling 301 eligible sources.
- Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation will be responsible for costs to collect from ineligible sources.

CM will charge Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation for the curbside collection of ineligible sources. The portion of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation's curbside collection operating costs associated with eligible sources will be determined by the relative number of eligible and ineligible sources receiving curbside collection. Using an example where there are 316 sources of Blue Box Material (301 eligible sources and 15 ineligible sources) receiving curbside collection services, CM would cover 100% of the collection costs represented by eligible sources ($301/316 \times 100 = 95\%$) and Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation would cover the balance or 5% of the curbside collection costs associated with ineligible sources.

CM will also support collection of beverage containers at special events such as the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation Annual Pow Wow and other gatherings.

Hauling

- CM will arrange with the curbside Blue Box collection service provider, Emterra to have the Blue Box Material collected curbside from eligible and ineligible sources and transferred to the HGC Brantford Receiving Facility located at 50 Shaver Street Brantford Ontario N3T 5M1.
- CM will charge the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation for the hauling costs associated with Blue Box Material collected from ineligible sources based on the cost sharing described above for curbside collection costs.
